



Dr. Samuel Studer was born in Zurich in 1979 and grew up in Ellikon an der Thur (canton of Zurich). After graduating from the cantonal high-school Büelrain in Winterthur, he studied history, media and communication science as well as philosophy and earned a doctorate in communication and media research.

During his studies in Zurich, he worked as a journalist for the «Landboten» for several years. After his graduation in 2008, he managed the radio «Stadtfilter» in Winterthur and published various articles on media historical topics. In 2011 he became a scientific project collaborator and a PhD student at the Institute for communication and media research at the University of Zurich, where he also did a postgraduation later on. Between 2011 and 2017, he was teaching and leading research projects on long term media transformation in Switzerland as well as on other political and historical subjects relating to media. His thesis on the structural changes of media in Switzerland was published in 2018 («Veränderungsprozesse in Mediensystemen», publisher: Nomos). Samuel Studer has been working for the Federal Office of Communications (OFCOM) as a media specialist since March 2017, where he's been focusing on the SRG, media research and digitalisation. Finally, he also works as a lecturer at the universities of Zurich and Fribourg as well as at the HTW Chur.
